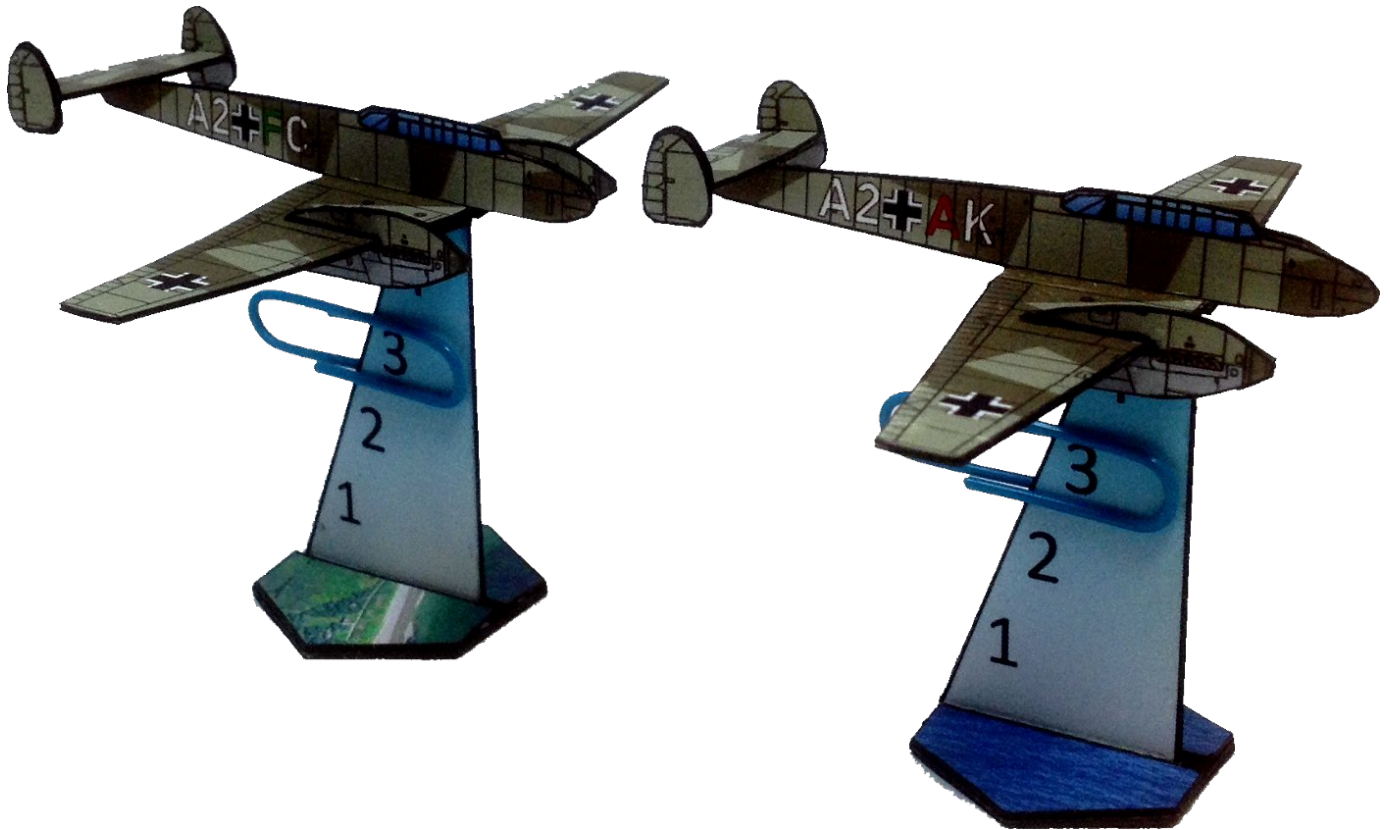

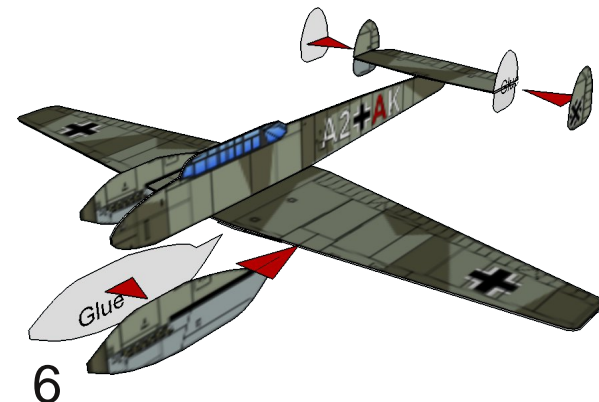
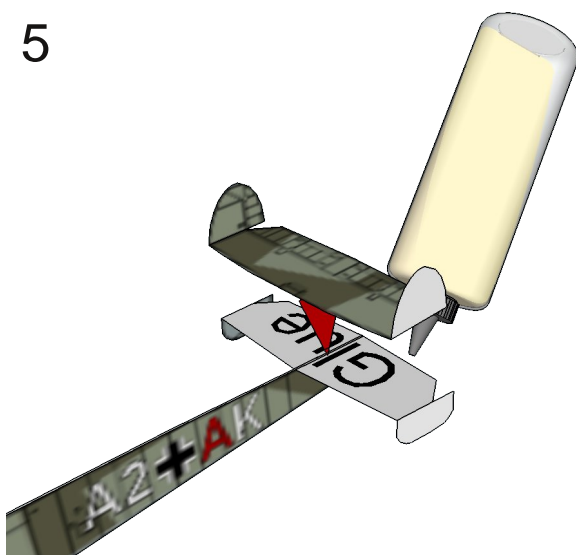
Tips for Assembly
